The 'Halloween Code'

We want you to stay safe when trick or treating by following the 'Halloween Code':

- 1 Always go trick or treating with an adult
- 2 Only go to houses where you or your friends know the residents
- 3 Don't knock on doors where there is a 'No Trick or Treat' sign
- 4 Stay in areas that are well lit with street lights take a torch with you just in case
- 5 Stay with your friends don't split into smaller groups unless an adult goes with you
- **6** Don't talk to strangers on the street
- 7 Don't enter any house stay on the doorstep
- 8 Be careful not to frighten vulnerable people, especially the elderly
- **9** Be visible
- Look carefully before crossing the road, even if you're part of a group
- Don't vandalise anything or throw things like eggs and flour. This can cause a great deal of damage and misery. What's more it can be classed as criminal damage, or even assault, and a night of 'fun' could end up with you in trouble with the police
