## DEFINITIONS

**part-time working** – For the Census part-time is defined as working 30 hours a week or less. Full time as working 31 or more hours a week.

**long-term unemployed** – those who stated that they have not worked since 1999 or earlier.

**Armed Forces** – Armed Forces figures comprise those people who responded “Armed Forces” to the industry question and “Commissioned Officer” or “other rank” to the occupation question. As some people in the Armed Forces may have given other occupations or industries, the figures in Table KS11 for “public administration & defence” are likely to underestimate the true figure.

**shared ownership** – pays part rent & part mortgage

**occupancy rating** – provides a measure of under-occupancy and over-crowding. For example; a value of -1 implies that there is one room too few and that there is overcrowding in the household. The rating assumes that every household; including one person households, requires a minimum of 2 common rooms (excluding bathrooms).

**dependent child** – a person in a household aged 0-15 (whether or not in a family) or a person aged 16-18 who is a full-time student & in a family with parent(s)

**pensioner** – male aged over 65 or female aged over 60.

**population** – information for the 2001 Census is collected on a usual address basis. Students & schoolchildren studying away from the family home are fully enumerated as resident at their term time address.
