The Development Management Development Plan Document\* was considered by an independent Examiner at Examination in May and June 2011. Any person aggrieved by the Development Management Development Plan Document may make an application to the High Court under section 113 of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004. Any challenge must be made on the grounds that:

- (a) the document is not within the appropriate power;
- (b) a procedural requirement has not been complied with.

Any such application must be made no later than 6 weeks after the date of this notice, i.e. **13<sup>th</sup> December 2011**.
