

DRAFT ORDER

LONDON BOROUGH OF RICHMOND UPON THAMES COUNCIL
CRIMINAL JUSTICE AND POLICE ACT 2001

**RICHMOND TOWN CENTRE (ALCOHOL CONSUMPTION IN
DESIGNATED PUBLIC PLACES) ORDER 2007**

1. The London Borough of Richmond upon Thames Council (“the Council”) in accordance with its powers under the Criminal Justice and Police Act 2001 (“the Act”) makes “The Richmond Town Centre (Alcohol Consumption in Designated Public Places) Order 2007” (“the Order”) on 20 June 2007 which comes into effect from 29 June 2007.
2. This Order designates an area of Richmond Town Centre to enable a constable to require a person not to consume in that place anything which is or which the constable reasonably believes to be alcohol and/or to require the person concerned to surrender anything in his possession which is or which the constable reasonably believes to be alcohol or a container for alcohol.
3. A person who fails without reasonable excuse to comply with the constable’s requirement commits an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding £500. A constable may dispose of anything surrendered to him in such manner as he considers appropriate. This is a discretionary power which may be utilised by the police and is not an alcohol ban in the town centre.
4. The area designated under this Order is Richmond Town Centre and the boundaries are shown on the attached map.
5. The Order does not apply to premises and their curtilage in respect of which a premises licence or club premises certificate is in effect and which authorises the supply / sale of alcohol, or premises that authorise the supply of alcohol by virtue of a temporary event notice and for 30 minutes after the expiry of the temporary event notice, or any place where facilities or activities relating to the sale or consumption of alcohol are for the time being permitted by virtue of a permission granted under section 115E of the Highways Act 1980.
6. Where the local authority holds a premises licence or occupies or has managed for it a premises that is subject to a premises licence authorising the sale or supply of alcohol, that premises will only be excluded from the Order in which it is situated at times when alcohol is actually being sold or supplied and for 30 minutes thereafter. At the time of making this Order, local authority does not hold, occupy or manage any premises licences within the designated area.

**TWICKENHAM TOWN CENTRE (ALCOHOL CONSUMPTION IN
DESIGNATED PUBLIC PLACES) ORDER 2007**

1. The London Borough of Richmond upon Thames Council (“the Council”) in accordance with its powers under the Criminal Justice and Police Act 2001 (“the Act”) makes “The Twickenham Town Centre (Alcohol Consumption in Designated Public Places) Order 2007” (“the Order”) on 20 June 2007 which comes into effect from 29 June 2007.
2. This Order designates an area of Twickenham Town Centre to enable a constable to require a person not to consume in that place anything which is or which the constable reasonably believes to be alcohol and/or to require the person concerned to surrender anything in his possession which is or which the constable reasonably believes to be alcohol or a container for alcohol.
3. A person who fails without reasonable excuse to comply with the constable’s requirement commits an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding £500. A constable may dispose of anything surrendered to him in such manner as he considers appropriate. This is a discretionary power which may be utilised by the police and is not an alcohol ban in the town centre.
4. The area designated under this Order is Twickenham Town Centre and the boundaries are shown on the attached map.
5. The Order does not apply to premises and their curtilage in respect of which a premises licence or club premises certificate is in effect and which authorises the supply / sale of alcohol, or premises that authorise the supply of alcohol by virtue of a temporary event notice and for 30 minutes after the expiry of the temporary event notice, or any place where facilities or activities relating to the sale or consumption of alcohol are for the time being permitted by virtue of a permission granted under section 115E of the Highways Act 1980.
6. Where the local authority holds a premises licence or occupies or has managed for it a premises that is subject to a premises licence authorising the sale or supply of alcohol, that premises will only be excluded from the Order in which it is situated at times when alcohol is actually being sold or supplied and for 30 minutes thereafter. At the time of making this Order, local authority does not hold, occupy or manage any premises licences within the designated area.
