AUTUMN TERM GALLERY WORKSHOPS



Re- Inventing the Selfie: Printed Portraits

6th October- 4th December

Investigate the difference between the traditional self portrait and the modern 'selfie'. Master printing techniques to create your own contemporary self portrait.

Curriculum Links

Early years

- -Describe shapes and spaces to develop drawing skills
- -Explore and observe the exhibition and find out about a range of artists.
- Develop creative ideas, thoughts and feelings using a range of materials

Ks 1 and 2 (Art and Design)

- Produce creative work exploring and sharing ideas and recording experiences -Develop drawing and printing skills

- Learn about the work of a range of artists, take part in critical discussion and make links to own work.



Virginia Woolf and The Hogarth Press: Budding Bookmakers

29th October- 10th December

Celebrate Richmond Literature Festival with your class: Explore the legacy of Virginia Woolf along with leading literary figures from the Borough and learn how to bind your own book.

Curriculum Links

-Early years

- -Develop interest in literature through visual and literary stimulus
- -Experience a rich language environment
- -Use a wide range of media and materials
- Ks 1 and 2 (Literature, Art and Design and Design and Technology),
- -Develop an appreciation of Richmond's rich and varied literary heritage
- -Use discussion and debate
- -Use a range of tools and equipment to perform practical tasks

In these sessions pupils will work with a professional artist to evaluate and analyse artworks through an interactive exhibition tour before exploring ideas and processes in a practical workshop. LOCAL HISTORY Workshops



Animate History- Meet the Locals All year round

Come and discover Mrs Nellie lonides, a significant person who lived in Richmond to find out the difference she made to local and British history. Each cross-curricular workshop is inspired by individual stories and explores animation techniques and technologies to put local history into context of wider historical significance and achievement.

Curriculum Links Early Years

-Promotes creative and critical thinking skills and early language and communication

- Develops making skills using animation techniques and technology

- A fun and creative introduction to understanding the history of our local area

Key stage 1 and 2(History and Art and Design)

-A study of an aspect of history or a site dating from a period beyond 1066 that is significant in the locality

- -Note connections, contrasts and trends over time
- Identify similarities and differences between ways of life in different periods

- Evaluate and analyse creative works using discussion and practical activities including animation, technoques and technology.



Literacy in the Landscape

All year round

Explore how the River Thames has inspired a range of great artists throughout history. Use descriptive writing, poetry and drawing to record and capture your own observations and ideas about the local landscape

Curriculum Links Early Years

- Explore and play with a wide range of media and materials -Share thoughts, ideas and feelings through a variety of activities


-Link sounds and letters to support reading and writing

Key stage 1 and 2(History.English, Art and Design)

- -Use methods of historical enquiry
- -Discover significant local historical events, people and places
- -Articulate ideas and structure them through writing and drawing

In these sessions pupils will explore historical sites and the borough art collection to gain an understanding of how art both reflect and shape our local history and contribute to the culture, creativity and wealth of our nation.

All sessions are suitable for early years, key stage 1-2 and special educational needs. Cost: ± 100 (Materials included) Session length: 2 hours

Garrick's Temple sessions are based at the Temple in Hampton.



Sessions include an art walk across marble hill park and a gallery session.

Garrick's Temple to Shakespeare

May-September

Discover Shakespeare and Garrick, one of our first 'star' actors. Learn how to make a mask, and bring to life a scene from either Macbeth or a Midsummer Night's Dream.

Key stage 1 and 2(History, English, Art and Design, Drama)

--Develop drama skills

-Appreciate our rich and varied literary heritage

-Develop making and design techniques

Turner's House

Follow in the footsteps of England's great landscape painter, J.M.W. Turner. Explore the local landscape that inspired Turner's artworks, thinking about why he lived in Richmond and trying out his sketchbook techniques.

Curriculum Links Early Years

-Share thoughts, ideas and feelings through design and drawing

- Explore and observe a historical site

Key stage 1 and 2 (History and Art and Design)

-Develop drawing from observation to record experiences

- -How to make and use a sketchbook to explore creative ideas
- Learn about a significant artist and his place in local history

You can get involved in this project in the following ways:




FREE Education Packs

Arts Award Object Box FREE Pilot workshops

As part of our 'From the Outside In' art and science project with Octagon Club and Transitions Art Group (our art clubs for children and young people with learning disabilities and special educational needs) we are creating an Arts Award Object box.

This interactive box will be used to deliver Discover Arts Award and be loaned out to schools to teach about science and art

The Arts Award object box will ;

- Include sensory objects, art activities and elements which encourage children and young people to experience art and science through hands on learning.
- Include science objects which are relevant to the project and will help children and young people discover and learn.
- Link directly to the Discover Arts Award.
- · Link to the Science and Art National Curriculum
- Include a log book / paper resource which links to the Discover Arts Award
- Be tailored to a variety of learning styles and abilities (specifically for SEN groups).


Richmond Buses from Richmond Station: 33, 490, H22, R68, R70
