What is the Register of Electors?

Also known as the Electoral Roll, this is simply a list of all people entitled to vote if they wish to. It is separate from other records such as Council Tax, so every household must complete their compulsory registration form every autumn for an up to date and accurate Register to be published by 1 December.

You can only vote if your name appears on the current electoral roll.

Once the register for each year is published, it is amended monthly for those who move house or change details. Anyone who does not re-register when they move home cannot vote from their new address, and are likely to find obtaining credit more difficult.

Who will have my details?

The Register is published in two separate versions. All names must appear on the **Full Register** as it is for election and crime prevention use.

Anyone can buy the **Edited Register**, but it ONLY includes those names who don't "opt-out" of having their details available.

To stop your details being sold to direct marketing firms who send out "junk mail", tick the column "**Stop my name being passed on to marketing firms**" against each name (this does not affect your right to vote or credit rating).

Next elections scheduled in our borough:

May 2012 - Mayor of London and Assembly

May 2014 - Richmond Council (local election)

June 2014 - European Union Parliament

May 2015 - General Election (UK Parliament)

These are subject to change, and a by-election could be called at any time.
