### LOADING PLACES ORDER

# THE LONDON BOROUGH OF RICHMOND UPON THAMES (LOADING PLACES) (AMENDMENT No. 22) ORDER 2006

Made: 6 March 2006

Coming into operation: 13 March 2006

The Council of the London Borough of Richmond upon Thames, having consulted with the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, in exercise of the powers conferred by Sections 6 and 124 of, and Part IV of Schedule 9 to, the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), as amended, and the Road Traffic Act 1991(b) and all other enabling powers hereby make the following Order:-

- This Order shall come into operation on 13 March 2006 and may be cited as The London Borough of Richmond upon Thames (Loading Places) (Amendment No. 22) Order 2006.
- 2. (1) In this Order the expression "enactment" means any enactment whether public, general or local and includes any order, bye-law, rule, regulation, scheme or other instrument having effect by virtue of an enactment.
  - (2) Any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, re-enacted by or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent enactment.
  - (3) The Interpretation Act 1978(c) shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
- 3. Without prejudice to the validity of anything done or to any liability incurred in respect of any act or omission before the coming into operation of this Order, The London Borough of Richmond upon Thames (Loading Places) Order 1994(d), as amended, shall have effect as though there was added to Schedule 11 to that Order the item numbered 11/2 and set out in columns 1, 2 and 3 Schedule to this Order.

#### SCHEDULE 11 [to 1994/3]

#### **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

(This Note is not part of the Order but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

The Order introduces a loading bay operating at any time on the west side of Queens Road, Richmond immediately to the south of its junction with Sheen Road and outside the "Black Horse" public house.

#### STATEMENT OF REASONS

The Order introduces a loading bay for the sole use of commercial vehicles whilst loading and unloading goods. It will operate at any time, and the maximum period for which any vehicle may wait is twenty minutes. The loading bay is being provided for the benefit of local shops and businesses and in particular for the benefit of the "Black Horse" public house, and as part of a junction improvement scheme at Sheen Road/Manor Road/Queens Road, Richmond. The works are intended to improve road safety.

### QUEENS ROAD, RICHMOND [Reference 21/06]

- The Council of the London Borough of Richmond upon Thames on the 6 March 2006 made the above Order under sections 6 and 124 of, and Part IV of Schedule 9 to, the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (as amended) and the Road Traffic Act 1991 (as amended).
- 2. The general effect of the Order is to introduce a loading place for the sole use of commercial vehicles whilst loading and unloading goods (with a maximum stay of 20 minutes) operating at any time on the west side of Queens Road, Richmond at its junction with Sheen Road and immediately outside the "Black Horse" public house.
- 3. Copies of the Order, which will come into operation on 13 March 2006, a plan showing the location and effect of the Order and the Council's Statement of Reasons for making the Order can be inspected for a period of 6 weeks from the date of this Notice, quoting Reference 21/06, at:-

- 5. Persons wishing to question the validity of the Order or any of its provisions on the grounds that it or they are not within the powers conferred by the 1984 Act, or that any requirement of the Act or any instrument made under the Act has not been complied with that person may, within six weeks from the date on which the Order was made, apply for the purpose to the High Court.
