3	 Vulnerable People within the Borough - Hoarders, Parm Sandhu, Chief Superintendent, Met Police Local priorities for the Met Police and Richmond Partnership to work together on were identified and include protecting the most vulnerable (including the elderly), theft of motor vehicles and burglary. There was discussion about hoarding, and the risks and dangers relating to this. ACTIONS: Awareness needs to be raised about hoarding. There is a need to work with statutory and voluntary partners to address these issues There is a need for social services to raise awareness of this issue to carers, to understand the risks of hoarding to carers, and to provide safeguarding to vulnerable people and carers This issue could be raised at the voluntary sector forum, and the Council can share information about this topic through its communication channels The definition of 'hoarding' is to be shared with the group Find out what the local authority does to address dangerous substances 	All CC, RT CC CoC

4	 Vulnerable People and the Community Safety Plan, Chris O'Connor, Fire Brigade An overview of fire issues and fire prevention plans, especially in terms of vulnerable people, was provided. There was discussion of the effects of medicine and medical equipment on the spread of fire. ACTIONS Information to be provided on the need for a building risk assessment for individual flats within a block There is a need for partners to work together to collaborate and manage the referrals. A shared database between partners should be developed to better manage referrals. There is a need for the borough's strategic assessment document to make reference to community safety Information on how to make a referral to be shared Partnership working between adult social services and the fire brigade on fall prevention to be developed The upcoming HWB public meeting in July on dementia and carers may be relevant to the fire brigade and will be contacted about the event.
