SUMMARY

Please summarise the key findings of the EINA.

The Council are consulting to ascertain if the public are in support of the proposal to add additional railings in keeping with the style of those already on the Green. The aim of this consultation is to gauge the level of support for additional railings in two locations 1) the Church side by junction with Botanist Public House and 2) on the pond side (Both areas indicated on map provided).

From assessing the data on DataRich, Kew is noted to have a lower population in comparison to the borough of people who characterise themselves as a disability which impacts their ability to complete day-to-day activities.

One positive impact of the proposal is that the railings will act as deterrent to future unauthorised encampments ensuring that the Green is used appropriately by all visitors.

1. Background

Briefly describe the service/policy or function:

The Council are consulting to ascertain if the public are in support of the proposal to add additional railings in keeping with the style of those already on the Green. A number of residents have expressed a desire to see additional fencing installed on Kew Green to prevent unauthorised access and encampments on the Green. The aim of this consultation is to gauge the level of support for additional railings in two locations 1) the Church side by junction with Botanist Public House and 2) on the pond side (Both areas indicated on map provided). A vehicle access gate will need to be installed on the pond side to allow Parks Maintenance vehicles access onto the Green, the proposed area for

this is highlighted in yellow on the map. This will require the removal of one parking space to the south of the gate to allow turning onto the Green.

Separate to this it should be noted that the Council is applying for a Final Injunction against 'Persons Unknown' to prevent unauthorised encampments at various green spaces in the Borough including Kew Green as this is considered our strongest line of defence from a Legal standpoint.
