Twickenham Yacht Club offers a clubhouse built around 1900 on the riverside near to York House gardens. There is a large open plan room downstairs leading to a new decked balcony overhanging the river with views downstream towards Richmond and upstream towards Eel Pie Island. Upstairs, there is a wood panelled room with bar, snooker table and seating areas.
