**North-East Richmond controlled parking zone (Bardolph Road area,  
Zone N) - Review changes and proposed extension consultation**

In November 2008, the Council undertook a review of the North-East Richmond controlled parking zone (CPZ). The purpose of this review was to ascertain from residents and businesses in the existing area on how the zone has worked since implementation and also to consult residents within the solid brown boundary area on proposals to extend the CPZ to this area.

The results of the consultation were reported to the Cabinet Member for Traffic, Transport and Parking in March 2009, when consideration was given to all representations received. The Cabinet Member has approved the formal advertisement of proposals (traffic management orders) to:

- Extend the North-East Richmond CPZ to Crown Terrace, Dee Road, Sheendale Road and Victoria Villas.
- Introduce minor operational amendments to the existing zone N parking area, specifically in Bardolph Road (see drawing attached) to replace 4.8m of the Pay and Display bay at the rear of 13 Trinity Road with double yellow lines.

These proposals are being formally advertised by way of traffic management orders on Friday 19 June 2009. The plans will be on display from this date at the Richmond Reference Library, Whittaker Avenue, Richmond and on the Council website [www.richmond.gov.uk](http://www.richmond.gov.uk).

Representations must be received on or by Friday 10 July 2009 and will be reported to the Cabinet Member. Implementation of the proposed extension and operational changes is scheduled to commence in August 2009 to come into operation on Monday 21 September 2009.
