

Job Description

Job Title: Journalist or photographer for new Youth Magazine (Outskirts) in Richmond upon Thames.

Purpose of Job: To work with Richmond Council to produce the community magazine/newspaper for young people in Richmond upon Thames. The purpose of the publication is to engage young people in issues that affect them and help them understand more about the work of the Council, its partners and events in the borough.

Duration: There are four editions of the magazine every year. Reporters and photographers must commit to at least four editions.

Main Duties:

To carry out balanced research to be able to write features/articles or to take photographs for the publication.

Working Conditions:

All those who apply for these positions must be able to dedicate a certain amount of time to the project. There will be a series of **compulsory** meetings that all journalists and photographers will be required to attend. Per edition there are approximately 8 meetings - over a period of three months – once a week for two hours. In addition to this, all writing and photography work must be carried out in the young person's own time. All the writers and journalists will be responsible for producing one article per edition.

Please do not apply for either of these positions if you are not able to dedicate the required time to the roles and if you already have a lot of activities planned on weekday evenings..

Qualifications and Experience

No specific qualifications or previous experience are required for this role.

Salary

Although there is no salary for this role – any expenses accumulated as a result of the role e.g. train fare, will be reimbursed. However, the Editor in Chief must be notified before any money is spent.

Provision will be made for any technology required e.g. computers, the Internet, cameras.

All candidates must submit an application form and ideally submit either a 300-word article or selection of photographs.

All candidates must have a signature from their parent / guardian regarding their participation in the project.

All successful applicants will be asked to sign a contract – agreeing to attend **all** the sessions required of them and to provide all the work required on time.
