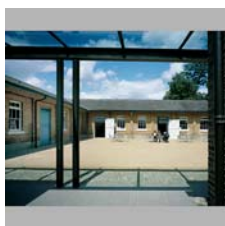


Exhibitions at the Stables Gallery in 2009



Located on site at Orleans House Gallery, the Stables Gallery is an exciting space with exhibitions separate from the main gallery. Schools are invited to visit the gallery anytime, but if you would like to book a workshop in conjunction with any of the below exhibitions, we can tailor them to your needs. You are also invited to view the Stables Gallery when participating in another workshop.

The workshops:

Our sessions for schools will support the delivery of the Art and Design curriculum, as well as History and Citizenship in a dynamic cross-curricular way. Sessions begin by looking at the original art-works and artefacts in the gallery – discussing what they depict, why and how they were made

We will encourage the exchange of ideas according to the level of the group's ability. Key terms of vocabulary will be used. Interactive discussion will be followed by practical workshop chosen relating to the following exhibitions:

Spring Term



2D-3D – until 11 January

Avril Vellacot and Anne Purkiss are artists based in the local borough. They use sculpture and photography to explore portraiture.

Will Bishop Stephens – 15 January -15 March

This exhibition will be the culmination of Will's time as artist-in-residence at Orleans House Gallery. He works with animation, sculpture and etching and has been involved with various educational projects with the gallery in the past.

Creative and Media Diploma – 19 March - 17 May

This exhibition will showcase the work of students studying for a creative and media diploma.

Summer Term

Millie and Spedding – 21 May - 21 June

This exhibition will represent portraits and photographs of the local area by the artists Millie and Spedding.

Sidelines – 25 June - 30 August

This is a group mixed-media show. More information will be available nearer to the time.

Our aims

Beyond the art historical and practical content of these sessions we aim to build pupils' confidence in speaking about what they see, sharing opinions and recognising likes and dislikes. Pupils will be encouraged to evaluate their own work and express what they think about the work of their peers in a sensitive way.
