TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT ORDER

THE LONDON BOROUGH OF RICHMOND UPON THAMES (WAITING AND LOADING RESTRICTION) (CIVIL ENFORCEMENT AREA) (AMENDMENT No. 15) **ORDER 2009**

Made: 16 March 2009

Coming into operation: 30 March 2009

The Council of the London Borough of Richmond upon Thames, having consulted the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, in exercise of the powers conferred by Sections 6 and 124 of, and Part IV of Schedule 9 to, the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), as amended, and all other enabling powers hereby make the following Order-

- This Order shall come into operation on 30 March 2009 and may be cited as the 1. London Borough of Richmond upon Thames (Waiting and Loading Restriction) (Civil Enforcement Area) (Amendment No. 15) Order 2009.
- 2. In this Order the expression "enactment" means any enactment whether public, (1) general or local and includes any order, bye-law, rule, regulation, scheme or other instrument having effect by virtue of an enactment.
 - Any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference (2) to that enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, re-enacted by or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent enactment.
 - (3) The Interpretation Act 1978(b) shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
- 3. Without prejudice to the validity of anything done or to any liability incurred in respect of any act or omission before the coming into operation of this Order, the London Borough of Richmond upon Thames (Waiting and Loading Restriction) (Civil Enforcement Area) (Consolidation No. 8) Order 2008(c), as amended, shall have effect as though:-
 - (a) for the items numbered 185, 237, 380 and 389 in Schedule 1 to that Order there were substituted the items similarly numbered and set out in columns 1, 2 and 3 of Schedule 1 to this Order:
 - (b) there were added to the items in Schedule 1 to that Order the items numbered 381A and 588A and set out in columns 1, 2 and 3 of Schedule 2 to this Order; and
 - (c) there were added to Schedule 3 to that Order the prescribed hours, the times and the restricted hours as set out in columns 1, 2 and 3 respectively of Schedule 3 to this Order.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

This Order introduces:-

- (a) waiting restrictions "no waiting at any time" at the junctions of Cromwell Road with Kingston Lane, Cromwell Road with Kingsmead Close, Kingston Lane with Langham Road and Fairfax Road with Rosebank Close, Teddington; and
- (b) waiting restrictions "no waiting between 8-9.30am and between 2.30-4pm on Mondays to Fridays inclusive" in lengths of Cromwell Road, Kingsmead Close and Fairfax Road, Teddington.

STATEMENT OF REASONS

The waiting restrictions will prevent dangerous parking at times of the day when children are normally going to or leaving the Collis Primary school, which has a vehicular access from Fairfax Road and a pedestrian access from Cromwell Road.

The Order will also prevent dangerous parking at any time at certain junctions in the nearby vicinity.

The restrictions are being proposed on the grounds of road safety, with particular consideration being given to school children as they go to and leave the Collis Primary school.

CROMWELL ROAD, FAIRFAX ROAD AND KINGSTON LANE, TEDDINGTON AND LOCAL SIDE STREETS

(Reference 88/08)

- 1. The Council of the London Borough of Richmond upon Thames propose to make the above Order under sections 6 and 124 of, and Part IV of Schedule 9 to, the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended.
- 2. The general effect of the Order will be to introduce waiting restrictions:-
 - (a) "no waiting at any time" at certain junctions in the vicinity of Cromwell Road, Fairfax Road and Kingston Lane as specified in schedule 1 to this notice; and
 - (b) "no waiting between 8.00-9.30am and between 2.30-4.00pm on Mondays to Fridays inclusive" in lengths of Cromwell Road, Fairfax Road and Kingsmead Close, Teddington as specified in schedule 2 to this notice.
- 3. Copies of the proposed Order, a plan showing the location and effect of the proposals and the Council's Statement of Reasons for proposing to make the Order can be inspected, quoting Reference 88/08, at:
 - (a) Hampton Wick Library, Bennett Close, Hampton Wick, Middlesex KT1 4AT; and
 - (b) Teddington Library, Waldegrave Road, Teddington, Middlesex TW11 8LG during opening hours, and
 - (c) the Civic Centre (Planning Reception, ground floor), 44 York Street, Twickenham between 9.15am and 5pm on Mondays to Fridays, except for Bank and other public holidays.
- 4. Please note that the Teddington library will be closed with effect from 10 November 2008 for refurbishment works, and it is expected that it will remain closed for approximately 4 months. Documents will be available for inspection at Hampton Wick and Civic Centre, as stated above.
- 5. Persons wishing to object to or support the proposals or any part thereof should write to the Manager for Highways and Transport, Civic Centre, 44 York Street, Twickenham TW1 3BZ within 21 days of the date of this Notice giving the grounds of their objection.

Proposed waiting restrictions - "no waiting at any time"

At the junctions of:-

(a) Cromwell Road with Kingston Lane:

both sides of Kingston Lane (the arm towards Teddington High Street) and the north side of Cromwell Road / Kingston Lane, for lengths of between 10 and 20 metres from the junction;

(b) Cromwell Road with Kingsmead Close:

both sides of Kingsmead Close for a length of 11 metres and the south side of Cromwell Road for lengths of up to 10 metres from the junction;

(c) Kingston Lane with Langham Road:

both sides of Langham Road and the north side of Kingston Lane, for lengths of between 8 and 17 metres from the junction; and

(d) Fairfax Road with Rosebank Close:

both sides of Rosebank Close for a length of 5 metres and the north-east side of Fairfax Road for lengths of 7.5 metres from the junction.

SCHEDULE 2

Proposed waiting restrictions - "no waiting between 8.00-9.30am and between 2.30-4.00pm on Mondays to Fridays inclusive"

At these locations:-

(a) Cromwell Road:

the north side, from the double yellow line restrictions at Udney Park Road for a length of 90 metres to a point opposite No 18D Cromwell Road;

the south side:

from a point outside No 18E Cromwell Road to the existing "school keep clear" markings outside No 26 Cromwell Road;

from the proposed double yellow lines at its junction with Kingsmead Close to a point at the junction with Kingston Lane approximately 10 metres to the east of Kingston Close;

(b) Kingsmead Close:

both sides, from the proposed double yellow lines at its junction with Cromwell Road for a length of approximately 23 metres (outside Nos 2-3 and Nos 17-18 Kingsmead Close); and

(c) Fairfax Road:

the south-west side, from the existing double yellow lines at its junction with Cromwell Road (near "Grosvenor Court") to the common boundary of Nos 135 and 141 Fairfax Road, excluding the length of the existing "school keep clear" markings outside Nos 141-145 Fairfax Road.

- 2. The general effect of the Order will be to introduce waiting restrictions:-
 - (a) "no waiting at any time" at certain junctions in the vicinity of Cromwell Road, Fairfax Road and Kingston Lane as specified in Schedule 1 to this notice; and
 - (b) "no waiting between 8.00-9.30am and between 2.30-4.00pm on Mondays to Fridays inclusive" in lengths of Cromwell Road, Fairfax Road and Kingsmead Close, Teddington as specified in Schedule 2 to this notice.
- 3. Copies of this Order, which will come into operation on 30 March 2009, a plan showing the location and effect of the Order and the Council's Statement of Reasons for making the Order can be inspected for a period of six weeks from the date of this Notice, quoting Reference 08/09, at:-
 - (a) the Hampton Wick Library, Bennett Close, Hampton Wick, Middlesex KT1 4AT during opening hours; and
 - (b) the Civic Centre (Planning Reception, ground floor), 44 York Street, Twickenham between 9.15am and 5pm on Mondays to Fridays, except for Bank and other public holidays.

- 5. Persons wishing to question the validity of this Order or any of its provisions on the grounds that it or they are not within the powers conferred by the 1984 Act, or that any requirement of the Act or any instrument made under the Act has not been complied with that person may, within six weeks from the date on which the Order was made, apply for the purpose to the High Court.

At the junctions of:-

- (e) Cromwell Road with Kingston Lane: both sides of Kingston Lane (the arm towards Teddington High Street) and the north side of Cromwell Road / Kingston Lane, for lengths of between 10 and 20 metres from the junction;
- (f) Cromwell Road with Kingsmead Close:

both sides of Kingsmead Close for a length of 11 metres and the south side of Cromwell Road for lengths of up to 10 metres from the junction;

(g) Kingston Lane with Langham Road:

both sides of Langham Road and the north side of Kingston Lane, for lengths of between 8 and 17 metres from the junction; and

(h) Fairfax Road with Rosebank Close:

both sides of Rosebank Close for a length of 5 metres and the north-east side of Fairfax Road for lengths of 7.5 metres from the junction.

SCHEDULE 2

Waiting restrictions - "no waiting between 8.00-9.30am and between 2.30-4.00pm on Mondays to Fridays inclusive"

At these locations:-

(d) Cromwell Road:

the north side, from the double yellow line restrictions at Udney Park Road for a length of 90 metres to a point opposite No 18D Cromwell Road;

the south side:

from a point outside No 18E Cromwell Road to the existing "school keep clear" markings outside No 26 Cromwell Road;

from the proposed double yellow lines at its junction with Kingsmead Close to a point at the junction with Kingston Lane approximately 10 metres to the east of Kingston Close;

(e) Kingsmead Close:

both sides, from the proposed double yellow lines at its junction with Cromwell Road for a length of approximately 23 metres (outside Nos 2-3 and Nos 17-18 Kingsmead Close); and

(f) Fairfax Road:

the south-west side, from the existing double yellow lines at its junction with Cromwell Road (near "Grosvenor Court") to the common boundary of Nos 135 and 141 Fairfax Road, excluding the length of the existing "school keep clear" markings outside Nos 141-145 Fairfax Road.
