TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT ORDER

THE LONDON BOROUGH OF RICHMOND UPON THAMES (WAITING AND LOADING RESTRICTION) (CIVIL ENFORCEMENT AREA) (AMENDMENT No. 18) ORDER 2009

Made: 20 April 2009

Coming into operation: 27 April 2009

The Council of the London Borough of Richmond upon Thames, having consulted the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, in exercise of the powers conferred by Sections 6 and 124 of, and Part IV of Schedule 9 to, the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), as amended, and all other enabling powers hereby make the following Order—

- This Order shall come into operation on 27 April 2009 and may be cited as the London Borough of Richmond upon Thames (Waiting and Loading Restriction) (Civil Enforcement Area) (Amendment No. 18) Order 2000.
- 2. (1) In this Order the expression "enactment" means any enactment whether public, general or local and includes any order, bye-law, rule, regulation, scheme or other instrument having effect by virtue of an enactment.
 - (2) Any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, re-enacted by or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent enactment.
 - (3) The Interpretation Act 1978**(b)** shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
- 3. Without prejudice to the validity of anything done or to any liability incurred in respect of any act or omission before the coming into operation of this Order, the London Borough of Richmond upon Thames (Waiting and Loading Restriction) (Civil Enforcement Area) (Consolidation No. 8) Order 2008(c), as amended, shall have effect as though:-
 - (a) for the items numbered 202, 285, 317, 390 and 494 in Schedule 1 to that Order there were substituted the items similarly numbered and set out in columns 1, 2 and 3 of Schedule 1 to this Order;
 - (b) there were added to the items in Schedule 1 to that Order the items numbered 162A, 238A, 465A, 654A and 664A and set out in columns 1, 2 and 3 of Schedule 2 to this Order: and
 - (c) there were added to Schedule 3 to that Order the prescribed hours, the time and the restricted hours as set out in columns 1, 2 and 3 respectively of Schedule 3 to this Order.

(This Note is not part of the Order but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

This Order introduces waiting restrictions:-

(a) "no waiting at any time" in lengths of:-

Colston Road, Sheen
Derby Road, Sheen
Fearnley Crescent, Hampton
Grasmere Avenue, Whitton
Hanworth Road, Hampton

Langridge Mews, Hampton Oak Avenue, Hampton South Road, Hampton Stanford Close, Hampton

and

(b) "no waiting between 8.30am and 5.30pm on Mondays to Fridays inclusive" in lengths of Morland Close, Hampton.

This Order also makes a correction to a previous amendment order, substituting the item numbered "87A" in place of the incorrect item numbered "78A" in Schedule 1.

STATEMENT OF REASONS

The Council receives complaints throughout the year on matters of road safety caused by parked vehicles. These complaints can be received from residents, Councillors and bus and emergency services. These matters include poor sight lines at junctions, obstruction of footway crossing points, lack of suitable passing areas and reduced carriageway width restricting or preventing access for vehicles especially emergency service vehicles.

This Order is intended to improve road safety for all users by .introducing waiting restrictions applying either at any time or for other specified hours. Similar restrictions have proved effective in locations elsewhere in the borough that previously suffered similar problems.

Grasmere Avenue, Whitton:

On the outside of the bend by Nos 7-17 Grasmere Avenue, approximately 40 metres overall.

Hawkesley Close, Twickenham:

West side, for approximately 30 metres from Waldegrave Park, on the flank of No 77 Waldegrave Park;

East side, for 7.5 metres from Waldegrave Park, on the flank of No 79 Waldegrave Park.

Hanworth Road, junction with Cannon Close, Hampton:

Hanworth Road, north-east side, 10 metres from junction with Cannon Close in both directions.

Hanworth Road, junction with Nursery Gardens, Hampton:

Hanworth Road, north-east side, 7.5 metres from junction outside No 320 Hanworth Road and for 16 metres from junction outside No 324 Hanworth Road.

Hounslow Road, in the vicinity of Kneller Road and Vicarage Road, Whitton:

Hounslow Road, north-east side (adjacent to St Philip and St James church), from outside No 96 Hounslow Road to outside No 104 Hounslow Road;
