

LICENSING ACT 2003

New and variation premises licence and club premises certificate applications currently closed to representation as at 6 May 2009

The Licensing Authority is now receiving applications for premises licences. The table below shows all the applications for new premises licences and variations of existing licences. For variation applications, only licensable activities being varied are shown. Interested parties (such as residents living in the vicinity of the premises) and responsible authorities (such as the police) can object to these applications.

The detail shown in the following table is limited to the opening hours applied for and the licensable activities. The hours for each licensable activity will be equal to or shorter than the opening hours.
