

LICENSING ACT 2003

New and variation premises licence and club premises certificate applications currently closed to representation as at 6 May 2009

The Licensing Authority is now receiving applications for premises licences. The table below shows all the applications for new premises licences and variations of existing licences. For variation applications, only licensable activities being varied are shown. Interested parties (such as residents living in the vicinity of the premises) and responsible authorities (such as the police) can object to these applications.

The detail shown in the following table is limited to the opening hours applied for and the licensable activities. The hours for each licensable activity will be equal to or shorter than the opening hours. Representations must be relevant to at least one of the four licensing objectives which are:-

- 4) Protection of children from harm

The Sub-committee was reminded by the applicant's representative that concerns raised by some interested parties in their written representations relating to traffic problems, road safety issues, delivery-times and littering were not matters for consideration by this Sub-committee. Such concerns have already been addressed by the imposition of certain conditions placed on the planning consent. Finally, the Sub-committee heard that the company believes that all alcohol promotions within its stores are undertaken in a sensible and responsible manner. In addition, if it is thought to be necessary, the Sub-committee heard that security staff would be deployed at the entrance to the store.</p> <p>Several interested parties attended the meeting and spoke to voice their concerns regarding the application. The Sub-committee heard that the surrounding area in which the store is located already suffers from incidents of petty crime and anti-social behaviour. Residents were concerned that these problems would increase with the addition of yet another retail outlet selling what they considered to be cheap alcohol. While the residents welcomed the reduction in the terminal hour to 22:00 hours, many felt that this was still too late in the evening. The fact that the Police were not objecting to the application was taken by some residents to be the consequence of many instances of criminal and anti-social activities going unreported. Residents believed that as a</p>

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		<p>consequence of this underreporting the Police perception was that this was a low crime area and their staffing levels were therefore reduced on this false premise.</p> <p>Having carefully considered the representations both in writing and orally at the hearing, the Sub-committee decided to GRANT the application for the amended times, as applied for. The Sub-committee felt that the applicant had met all four licensing objectives.</p> <p>As part of the operating schedule, the applicant had volunteered a number of conditions with a very slight agreed amendment. The Sub-committee learnt that noise-monitoring equipment will be employed on-site and a figure of 55^{db} has been agreed with Commercial Environmental Health as a level that will not cause disturbance to local residents.</p> <p>The applicants' representative indicated that the main purpose of the application was to formalise what is the current position and to allow for one or more marquees with a capacity of between 250-300 people to be erected, in a location indicated on the plan included as part of the application. 		<p>was confirmed that attendance at all of these evening functions would be by invitation only.</p> <p>The interested party attended the meeting and expressed his concerns on the proposals, in particular on the unsuitability of a marquee for the activities proposed. He felt by its very nature and construction material, it would allow sound inside the structure to easily escape and travel across the surrounding open ground in the direction of his home on Kew Foot Road. In his view this would be intrusive. There were he felt other more suitable locations on the site for such a structure to be erected where residents would be less disturbed.</p> <p>Having heard and considered all the evidence presented by the applicant and the interested party at the hearing, the Sub-committee decided to GRANT the application.
