

LICENSING ACT 2003

New and variation premises licence and club premises certificate applications currently closed to representation as at 6 May 2009

The Licensing Authority is now receiving applications for premises licences. The table below shows all the applications for new premises licences and variations of existing licences. For variation applications, only licensable activities being varied are shown. Interested parties (such as residents living in the vicinity of the premises) and responsible authorities (such as the police) can object to these applications.

The detail shown in the following table is limited to the opening hours applied for and the licensable activities. The hours for each licensable activity will be equal to or shorter than the opening hours. The Sub-Committee felt that some of the behaviour described could be attributed to the "Barmy Arms".</p> <p data-bbox="779 1148 1990 1297">In balancing the residents' right to peaceful enjoyment of their properties against the Applicant's right to trade, the Sub-Committee felt that it was appropriate in the light of the representations received to limit the hours for the sale of alcohol to 11.00pm on Sunday through to Thursday and to 12.00 midnight on Friday and Saturday. The Sub-Committee was pleased to learn that the Applicant had volunteered to finish live music at 11.00pm, everyday.</p>

The Sub-committee heard from the applicants' representative, that in January 2008 when they submitted their previous application for a new premises licence, the applicants were poorly advised and as a consequence were unaware that the premises fell within the Twickenham Cumulative Impact Zone. The applicants are now aware of what is expected of them, and have submitted what they consider to be an application that not only fully addresses the four licensing objectives, but also outlines their business intentions more clearly. The Sub-</p>

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		<p>committee heard that it is not their intension to operate as an off-licence, but rather as a convenience store specialising in Polish foods, with alcohol being sold as an ancillary product line.</p> <p>The applicants' representative informed the Sub-committee that his clients have spent a considerable amount of money refurbishing the premises and installing a CCTV system. Should the application be granted, his clients are prepared to provide litterbins outside the shop and to have the premises address printed on their carrier bags so that any such discarded litter may be traced back to their premises. In an effort to prevent underage sales of alcohol they intend to operate a 'Challenge 21' policy, and in addition, will prominently display notices reminding customers that it is an offence for adults to knowingly purchase alcohol for consumption by those under the age of 18. The Sub-committee heard that there would always be at least one Personal Licence holder working in the premises during opening hours.</p> <p>The applicants' representative stated that although the premises is located in the Twickenham Cumulative Impact Zone his clients do not consider that granting their application will add to the anti-social behavioural problems in the area, as described by the interested parties and the Metropolitan Police in their written representations.</p> <p>The Licensing Sergeant outlined the reasons for the Police objection to the application. The premises are situated in central Twickenham in an area the Police consider to be a crime 'hot-spot'. It is located in the Twickenham Cumulative Impact Zone. The applicants are therefore required to demonstrate that granting a Premises Licence will not have an adverse effect upon the cumulative impact already being encountered in Twickenham Town Centre.</p> <p>The Sub-committee heard that the applicants' proposal to sell alcohol for between 12 to 14 hours every day is, in the view of the Police, likely to have an adverse impact on the quality of life of those residents living nearby. The Sub-committee was made aware that there are already a number of licensed premises in the immediate vicinity of the applicants' premises. In a recent Police operation targeting under-age sales of alcohol from off-licences in Twickenham town centre, the Sub-committee heard that in 80% of the premises visited, sales were made to those under the age of 18 years.</p> <p>The Police concerns were reiterated by several of the interested parties in their addresses to the Sub-committee. The representative from the Twickenham Town Centre Management</p>

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		<p>Board, an interested party whose parents run a nearby local commercial business, and a local resident, all spoke to express concerns regarding the application. It was their collective view that the granting of a premises licence for "Best One" would not enrich the retail offer. Strong concerns were held by all that there are already enough premises in the area selling alcohol and the granting of an additional licence would compromise the Crime and Disorder licensing objective. The Sub-committee heard that alcohol is already sold at another shop located almost next door to "Best One", but there the premises close at 20:00 hours during the week and even earlier on the weekend. The applicants' representative stated to the Sub-committee that his clients believed that for their business to be economically viability it was essential for them to sell alcohol. As much of their business is transacted in the evening they were therefore not prepared to reduce the terminal hours sought.</p> <p>The interested parties felt it was likely in this largely residential area that anti-social behaviour, and crime and disorder would increase and consequently Police resources, which were already stretched, would be put under even greater pressure. The Sub-committee were also reminded that there are several schools sited only a short distance away from the applicants' premises and this could potentially lead to the Protection of Children from Harm licensing objective being compromised.</p> <p>Before the Sub-committee retired to make its determination on the application, the Council's legal adviser informed those present that she had earlier reminded the Sub-committee that, as stated in para. 4.2 of the Councils' Licensing Policy, the premises is located in the Twickenham Cumulative Impact Zone and therefore, unless the applicant can satisfy the Sub-committee that the granting of a premises licence will not have an adverse effect on the cumulative impact in the area, the application should normally be refused.</p> <p>After careful consideration of the evidence presented in the letters of representation, and orally at the hearing, the Sub-committee decided to REFUSE the application. In particular in reaching their decision the Sub-committee gave significant weight to representation made by the Police. The applicants, Mr Baljeet Singh Chopra and Mr Surinder Singh Chopra were represented by Mr Bahal, who spoke in support of the application. Licensing Sergeant Knox from Richmond Police Station, accompanied by Ms Nikki Weston a licensing officer, spoke as a responsible authority in objection to the application. Mr J. Bell on behalf of the Twickenham Town Centre Management Board, Mr Yogesh Modi on behalf of Mr and Mrs Modi and Mr D. Williams, also on behalf of Mrs S. Williamson and Ms J. Fairweather, all spoke as interested parties in objection</p>

<p>Best One 55 Kings Street Parade Twickenham Middx TW1 3SG</p>	<p>Twickenham Riverside</p>	<p>Licensable activities applied for: M</p> <p>Mon-Sat 09:00 – 23:00 Sun 10:00 – 22:00</p> <p>Hearing 17 January 2008</p> <p>The Sub-committee was required to hear and determine an opposed application for a new premises licence for "Best One" at 55, King Street Parade, Twickenham to permit the sale of alcohol for consumption off the premises between 09:00 hours and 23:00 hours from Monday to Saturday and 10:00 hours to 22:00 hours on Sunday.</p> <p>The interested party's representative briefly outlined the nature of the application to the Sub-committee. Although the premises is located in the Twickenham Cumulative Impact Zone the applicant does not consider that granting the application will add to the problems in the area, as described by the interested parties and the Metropolitan Police in their written representations. The applicant has previous experience in running an off-licence and holds a Personal Licence. The Sub-committee heard that he would endeavour to ensure that alcohol is not sold to those under the legal age limit.</p> <p>The Police Licensing Sergeant outlined the reasons for his objection to the application. The applicant has not completed Section 'P' of the application form detailing how he intended to address the four Licensing objectives thus making it very difficult to make a balanced judgement on how the business will be operated. In addition, the premises is situated in central Twickenham in an area the Police consider to be a crime hot-spot. It is also located in the Cumulative Impact Zone, which requires the applicant to demonstrate that granting his licence application will not have a detrimental impact on the locality. The applicant's proposal to sell alcohol for between 12 and 14 hours every day is in the view of the Police likely to have an adverse impact on residents living nearby. The close proximity of several secondary schools to the premises was also an additional Police concern. The Sub-committee were reminded that should the Sub-committee be minded to grant the application, this would then be the fourth licensed premises in this locality.</p>

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		<p>The Police concerns were reiterated by several of the interested parties in their addresses to the Sub-committee. The representative from the Twickenham Town Centre Management Board, an interested party whose parents run a nearby local business and a local resident all spoke to say that there was little that could be said in favour of the application. By failing to indicate how the four licensing objectives would be promoted, it was in their opinions likely that the crime and disorder, anti-social behaviour and the protection of children from harm licensing objectives would all be compromised.</p> <p>After careful consideration of all that they had heard and read the Sub-committee decided to REFUSE the application.</p> <p>At the request of one of the interested parties, the Council's Legal Adviser confirmed that he had on request given legal advice in relation to the Cumulative Impact Policy to the Sub-committee.</p> <p>The applicant, Mr Baljeet Singh Chopra, was represented by Mr Daljit Kapoor, who spoke in support of the application. Licensing Sergeant Knox from Richmond Police Station spoke as a responsible authority in objection to the application. Mr J. Bell on behalf of the Twickenham Town Centre Management Board, Mr Yogesh Modi on behalf of Mr and Mrs Modi and Mr D. Williams also speaking on behalf of Mrs S. Williamson and Ms J. Fairweather, residents of Poulett Gardens all spoke as interested parties in objection to the application.</p>

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		<p>permit the following:</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;">to open 24 hours per day from Sunday to Saturday, and be permitted to sell alcohol during the whole of this period.</p> <p>The Sub-committee heard from the Councils legal representative that the applicant currently has a Premises Licence which requires him to selling alcohol and close at 23:00 hours.</p> <p>As Bevy Food & Wine is located within the Twickenham Cumulative Impact Zone the Sub-Committee carefully considered the application in accordance with the Cumulative Impact Policy. Under the policy, the presumption is to refuse the application unless the applicant can demonstrate that the grant of the application will not add to the existing cumulative impact already being encountered.</p> <p>As the applicant did not attend the hearing, the Sub-committee had to consider and determine the application on the information contained in the application form. It was the view of the Sub-committee that there was insufficient information provided within the application to allow it to conclude that the grant of a 24-hour licence would not add to the cumulative impact.</p> <p>The Sub-committee also heard from the Police, who urged the Sub-committee to refuse the application. The Police explained that York Street and the surrounding area is identified as a 'hotspot' and that the granting of a licence to sell alcohol for 24 hours per day every day would risk escalating the crime and disorder problems already prevalent in the area. The Police explained that they had not spoken to the applicant, despite several attempts to do so. The Sub-committee gave this evidence a significant amount of weight.</p> <p>The applicant and the one interested party did not attend the hearing, but in reaching their decision the Sub-committee took the matters raised in his letter of representation along with the written and oral evidence presented by the Police into consideration and decided to REFUSE the application.</p> <p>Licensing Officer Ms Nikki Weston spoke on behalf of the Metropolitan Police as a Responsible Authority objecting to the application.</p>

The Sub-Committee considered the letters of representation.
