
PARKING PLACES ORDER

THE LONDON BOROUGH OF RICHMOND UPON THAMES (EAST SHEEN) (PARKING PLACES) (AMENDMENT No. 5) ORDER 2012

Made: 30 May 2012

Coming into operation: 18 June 2012

The Council of the London Borough of Richmond upon Thames, having consulted the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, in exercise of the powers conferred by Sections 45, 46, 19 and 124 of, and Part IV of Schedule 9 to, the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), as amended, and all other enabling powers hereby make the following Order —

1. This Order shall come into operation on 18 June 2012 and may be cited as the London Borough of Richmond upon Thames (East Sheen) (Parking Places) (Amendment No. 5) Order 2012.
2.
 - (1) In this Order the expression “enactment” means any enactment whether public, general or local and includes any order, bye-law, rule, regulation, scheme or other instrument having effect by virtue of an enactment.
 - (2) Any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, re-enacted by or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent enactment.
 - (3) The Interpretation Act 1978(b) shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
3. without prejudice to the validity of anything done or to any liability incurred in respect of any act or omission before the coming into operation of this order, the provisions of the London Borough of Richmond upon Thames (East Sheen) (Parking Places) Order 2001(c), as amended, shall have effect as though there were added to the items in Schedule 8 to that Order the item numbered 9B and set out in columns 1 and 2 of the Schedule to this Order.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

This Order adds Rock Avenue as an address which qualifies residents and business users as being eligible to apply for parking permits for the East Sheen controlled parking zone.

ROCK AVENUE, SHEEN

(Reference 27/12)

1. The Council of the London Borough of Richmond upon Thames on 30 May 2012 made the above-mentioned Order under sections 45, 46, 49 and 124 of, and Part IV of Schedule 9 to, the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (as amended) and the Traffic Management Act 2004.
2. The general effect of the Order is to allow residents of Rock Avenue, Sheen to continue to be eligible to apply for residents' parking permits for the East Sheen controlled parking zone. This eligibility will also extend to residents of Nos 1-3 Rose Cottages, Rock Avenue. This order continues in force indefinitely the provisions of the London Borough of Richmond upon Thames (East Sheen) (Parking Places) (No. 1) Experimental Order 2010.
3. Copies of the Order, which will come into operation on 18 June 2012, plans showing the location and effect of the scheme and the Council's Statement of Reasons for making the Order:-
 - (a) can be inspected for a period of 6 weeks, quoting Reference 27/12, at the Civic Centre (Central Reception, ground floor), 44 York Street, Twickenham between 9.15am and 5pm on Mondays to Fridays, except for Bank and other public holidays; and

If any person wishes to question the validity of the Order or of any of its provisions on the grounds that it or they are not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or that any requirement of the said Act of 1984 or of any instrument made under the said Act of 1984 has not been complied with, that person may, within 6 weeks from the date on which the Order was made, apply for the purpose to the High Court.

STATEMENT OF REASONS FOR MAKING THIS ORDER

In 2010 the Council extended the East Sheen CPZ to include Trehern Road. On considering an objection to that proposal, the Council decided that residents of Rock Avenue should be eligible to apply for parking permits, but that this facility should initially be introduced as an experimental scheme.

Having considered the outcome of that experiment, including one statutory objection, the Council has decided that there is no valid reason why the scheme should not become permanent. Therefore, this order makes the requisite amendment to the parking places order, which adds Rock Avenue (including Nos 1-3 Rose Cottages) to the items in Schedule 8 to that order. Persons who are residents of any of these properties continue to be eligible to apply for a parking permit for the East Sheen controlled parking scheme.

EAST SHEEN CONTROLLED PARKING ZONE

1. **NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that the Council of the London Borough of Richmond upon Thames made the above mentioned Order on 6 December 2010 under sections 9 and 10 of, and Part IV of Schedule 9 to, the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended.
 2. The general effect of the Order will be to include Rock Avenue, including Nos 1-3 Rose Cottages, as addresses which will be used to define the terms "resident" and "business user" for the East Sheen controlled parking scheme. Residents of Rock Avenue will be eligible to apply for parking permits, including resident visitor permits, for this zone.
 3. Full details of the Order, which will come into operation on 20 December 2010, are contained in the following documents:-
 - (a) the Order;
 - (b) a plan indicating the location and effect of the restrictions; and
 - (c) the Council's Statement of Reasons for making the Order.

This Order provides that in pursuance of section 10(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 the Assistant Director of Environment of the London Borough of Richmond upon Thames, or other person authorised in that behalf by that officer may, if it appears to that officer or to that person essential in the interests of the expeditious, convenient and safe movement of traffic, or of the provision of suitable and adequate parking facilities on the highway, or for preserving or improving the amenities of the area through which the roads affected by this Order run, modify or suspend this Order or any provision thereof.
 7. If the provisions of this Order continue in operation for a period of not less than six months, the Council will consider in due course whether the its provisions should be reproduced and continued in force indefinitely by means of an Order under section 45, 46 and 49 of the said Act of 1984. Persons wishing to object to or support the making of such Order for the purpose of such reproduction and continuation in force may, within the period of six months referred to above (ie by 19 May 2011), send a statement in writing of their objection and the grounds of that objection to the address below.

Experimental Order 2010**

STATEMENT OF REASONS FOR MAKING THIS ORDER

The Council has proposed that the East Sheen CPZ be extended to include Trehern Road. On considering the objections to that proposal, the Council decided that residents of Rock Avenue should be eligible to apply for parking permits, but that this facility should initially be introduced as an experimental scheme.

This scheme is being introduced on an experimental basis to give the Council of the London Borough of Richmond upon Thames powers to make modifications or variations to the scheme in the light of operational experience.

The Council will consider in due course whether to make a permanent Order the effect of which will be to reproduce and continue in force indefinitely the provisions of this Order.
