The Richmond upon Thames (Prescribed Routes)
(No. 1) Traffic Order 1974

Made 13 June 1974

Coming into operation 19 June 1974

The Greater London Council, after consulting the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis and the Council of the London Borough of Richmond upon Thames, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 6 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967(a), as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968(b), and of all other powers thereunto enabling hereby make the following Order:-

- 1. (1) This Order shall come into operation on 19 June 1974 and may be cited as the Richmond upon Thames (Prescribed Routes) (No. 1) Traffic Order 1974.
- (2) The Interpretation Act 1889(c) shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
- 2. No person shall cause any vehicle to proceed in any length of road in the London Borough of Richmond upon Thames specified in column 1 of the Schedule to this Order in a direction other than that specified in relation to that length of road in column 2 of the said Schedule.
- 3. Nothing in this Order shall apply to anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform.
