Why do we need your personal data?

The data we collect is used to ensure that public money distributed through the Education Skills Funding Agency is being spent in line with government targets for quality and value for money, for planning, and to make the case for the sector in seeking further funding.

What happens to your personal data?

The Richmond Adult Community Learning provision is directly funded through a Central Governament contract between London Borough of Richmond Upon Thames and the Education and Skills Funding Agency (ESFA) delivered by Richmond Borough Council.

The ESFA require the Local Authority to return monthly learner data to them to comply with the contractual and financial requirements of this contract.

Adult Community Learning (ACL) therefore require **ALL** providers to ensure that **ALL** learners participating on a ACL funded activity or course, complete **ALL** fields of personal information required by the **ACL enrolment and feedback forms**.

The level of personal detail required by these forms is a minimum and mandatory requirement placed on us by the GLA.

Once your provider/tutor has securely and safely returned these completed forms directly to us, the data is swiftly entered onto a password protected Management Information System, which is managed by an external hosting company called Tribal.

A data sharing agreement between the Local Authority and Tribal is in place to ensure your personal information remains secure and confidential at all times.

On a monthly basis Community Learning return this learner data to ESFA via an encyptred password protected online government portal.
