Code of conduct for individual residents walking 5-6 dogs

The purpose of the code of conduct is:

- 1. Ensure considerate use between those undertaking permitted multiple dog walking activities in the park and other park users.
- 2. To protect the parks and their wildlife.
- 3. To ensure access to and use of public open space is preserved for all visitors.

The Code

The permit holder shall not have exclusive rights over any area of the Authority's Premises and due consideration is given to members of the general public visiting the Authority's Premises.

Permit holders shall leave the Authority's Premises in a clean and tidy condition and be liable for any loss of or damage to any Authority's Property through their direct improper use.

The permit holder shall abide by the terms and conditions of the permit and the relevant legislation.

Every dog while on public land must wear a collar with the name, phone number and address of the owner inscribed on it or a plate or badge attached to it.

Ensure you have a lead for each of your dogs.

Remove all dog waste that arises from your dogs by placing it in a tightly sealed bag and taken home or deposited in the bins marked for dog waste or in the general waste bins.

Be considerate about where you allow your dogs to urinate, when entering parks, especially where the entrance is adjacent to residential areas.

Do not display aggressive, intimidating or unruly behaviours that interfere with the comfort of other visitors.

Do not apply corporal punishment towards any dogs

Ensure the dogs you are walking do not threaten or interfere with wildlife or the enjoyment of other park users. Do not permit your dog to chase, injure or kill any form of wildlife

As a permit holder you agree to abide by these guidelines at all times. Non-compliance o the above Code of Conduct may result in the withdrawal of the permit.
