Over the weekend of 8 and 9 July, Team Richmond competed in the Crystal Palace finals weekend which saw the 2017 London Youth Games season come to a close. Over 140 participants from 22 schools within the borough were up against stiff opponents in their respective competitions to see who would be crowned London's best.



It was a weekend of nail-biting action with some fantastic performances throughout, from all of the teams involved. Some notable performances included the Aquathlon squad who won overall gold, the Girls Hockey and Boys Swimming squad who won overall silver and the Girls Athletics squad who claimed bronze.

Other notable performances included Girls Basketball finishing 4th, Archery 4th, Indoor Rowing and Boys Hockey 7th and Girls Football 9th.
