AIR QUALITY SUPPLEMENTARY PLANNING DOCUMENT (SPD)

ADOPTION STATEMENT

In accordance with Regulation 14 of the Town and Country Planning (Local Planning) (England) Regulations 2012 (As amended), notice is hereby given that the Air Quality Supplementary Planning Document (SPD) was formally adopted by the Council on 2nd June 2020.

The Air Quality SPD adds detailed guidance to assist with the implementation of the adopted Local Plan (2018). The SPD will provide clear information for developers about what is required when making planning applications, and how planning applications will be evaluated in terms of air quality. The Air Quality SPD forms part of the Council's planning policy framework and is now a material consideration in the determination of planning applications.
