SUMMARY

As part of Richmond Council's continued commitment to improve our Parks and Open Spaces, the Council's Parks team are proposing to install a new outdoor gym at Moormead and Bandy Recreation Ground in partnership with the local Friends Group. The new equipment will be installed adjacent to the playground and will provide park users will exercise equipment, bringing health benefits through exercise.

1. Background

The Council are proposing to install a selection of new outdoor fitness equipment on Moormead and Bandy Recreation Ground, providing a new facility for park users and residents to exercise outdoors. The new equipment will be a combination of static and moving units to provide users with different training options.

2. Analysis of need and impact
