As part of Richmond Council's continued commitment to improve our parks and open spaces, Richmond's Parks Team are proposing to increase the amount of play provision currently available in Alpha Road Gardens.

1. Background

The Council's proposal is to utilise an underused area within the existing play area to accommodate either a new small basket swing or a small climbing frame. The site is geared towards younger children aged 8 and below.

In addition to installing one of the above units, the Council also plans to install a number of play panels along the existing perimeter fence of the playground.
