Friendly Parks for All: project aims

- Understand the barriers to spending time in parks.
- Improve opportunities to engage with parks for residents to enjoy by improving access for people that face barriers to spending time in parks.
- Promote the benefits of engaging with the natural environment for health and wellbeing especially for groups who have identified inequalities and face barriers to accessing these spaces.
- Provide tailored interventions that address these identified inequalities in order to address barriers to access and inequalities

Friendly Parks for All activities

A new programme of activities for 2022 is available on the parks pages of Richmond Council website.

- A monthly accessible walk in partnership with Ruils offers the
 opportunity for regular exercise to those with mobility
 problems or who need additional support. There is an
 opportunity to socialise and enjoy spending time in beautify
 parks walking on an accessible path with good links to public
 transport and disabled access toilets. The accessible walk takes
 place in Twickenham.
- A monthly wellbeing walk held in partnership with Richmond Borough Mind and Ruils which offers the opportunity to explore different parks and open spaces in the borough with others.

The Litter Challenge

New activity for 2022



Starting in March Friendly Parks for All project will offer monthly litter picks in 2 of the Friendly Parks for All - Barnes Green and Kneller Gardens for a trial period of 6 months.

The parks have been chosen as they are part of wider network of open spaces and so offer opportunities for longer walks than the other Friendly Parks. They are also located in different parts of the borough.

The walks are open to all and will be 1 hour long. They will be drop-in sessions, although we will ask participants to pre-register for their first session so that we know how many people to expect in advance. The activity will include opportunities to socialise.


The activity will welcome all participants but is be designed to include those with limited mobility and to be dementia inclusive. Those with personal care needs will be asked to bring a carer to help them to offer assistance.

Reimaging Richmond

As part of the response to Richmond Council Climate Change emergency the Friendly Parks for All project is working with young people on a project called **Reimagining Richmond**. Four groups of young people are envisioning a more biodiverse borough and how it might look if it was improved for wildlife and people.

One of the outcomes of the project is resources for schools and youth groups to use to improve their green spaces in response to the climate change emergency. It is hoped that these will be launched in Spring 2022 and made available on the Council website.







Developing a "Friendly Park for All" in Kneller Gardens

The Friendly Parks for All project has the aim of encouraging access to parks for people who face barriers. In Kneller Gardens the project is working with a group of visually impaired and blind park users who are advising on access to the park and equipment in the park.

Following an initial consultation with the group, the parks team at Richmond Council have:

- Painted the tops of bollards in the park white to help with visibility;
- Moved one of the wheelchair accessible picnic tables to increase accessibility from the path network;
- Included wheelchair spaces alongside 3 benches;
- The refurbished pavilion will include some tactile signage with braille characters;
- Installed a bench with a higher seat and additional arm rests for the use by people with limited mobility. Following positive feedback there are proposals to include similar benches in all the Friendly Parks for All parks. They will be located close to entrances/exits following feedback from park users.

The parks team would be pleased to hear any feedback from on the new features or additional suggestions for improvements that would make the park accessible to blind/visually impaired park users.







The Seeds of Change project is managed London through the Borough Richmond of Parks Department. It aims to encourage more use of parks and open spaces by local people.
