## **Proposals**

It should be noted that current financial constraints on the Council mean that proposals for which it is responsible may take longer than is desirable to implement



## **Environmental Improvements**

- I The use of colour on exterior walls is sometimes controversial. The Council is generally not in favour of the painting of brickwork, but considers the use of pastel or natural tints to be generally preferable to very bright colours. Design guidance will be issued to advise on the use of colour on historic façades **Council**
- 2 Street congestion is perceived to be a growing problem and the Council is committed to ensuring that parking problems in residential streets do not get any worse by continuing to review and monitor the situation **Council**
- 3 The small corner shops in the area are considered to be an important feature in the community and their closure/conversion will be resisted Council
- 4 The pavements in poor condition should be resurfaced. Paving stones where broken to be replaced with appropriate surfaces, i.e. granite setts or York stone slabs.

It is particularly important that slabs of a similar scale to the originals should be used **Council** 

- 5 The dumping of garden refuse on railway land is unsightly and damages the fences retaining it. Residents should be informed that this practice is unacceptable Railtrack
- 6 Consider the replacement of concrete post and chainlink fences with railings Railtrack
- 7 The damaged wall at the east end of Railway Side should be repaired or rebuilt using stock brick

- 8 Replacement of concrete lamp columns in the conservation area with dark green steel columns Council
- 9 Introduction of bicycle bars in Archway Street to slow cyclists at blind corners
