RICHMOND: A FAIRTRADE BOROUGH

What it means to be a Fairtrade borough:

- The Council has passed a Resolution supporting Fairtrade, and undertakes to serve Fairtrade coffee and tea at meetings and functions.
- A range of Fairtrade products is readily available in shops, cafés and restaurants (see map overleaf).
 To be included, a retail outlet must stock at least four Fairtrade product ranges and a catering outlet must serve at least two Fairtrade products.
- Fairtrade products are used by a number of local work places (offices, hospitals, etc) and community groups (schools, faith groups, etc).
- A local Fairtrade steering group promotes Fairtrade.

But it doesn't stop there. The borough needs...

- more traders to sell more products
- more workplaces using Fairtrade products
- more schools to become Fairtrade schools
