Newspapers and magazines



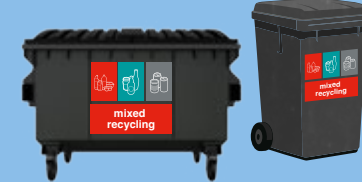
Junk mail

Clean foil and metal food trays

Empty aerosol cans

Cartons (Tetra Pak, juice boxes and milk)

Used kitchen towels, wet wipes and tissues

Get bikes repaired or to donate, book a slot with [Townmead Road Recycling Centre](#).

Repair or take your items to a community bank.



Paint

Drop off leftover paint at [Townmead Road](#), where it's reused by local groups and schools.



Other items

[Freecycle](#), charity shops and social media pages help you give and sell unwanted items.



Library of Things

Borrow items instead of buying new ones.
