

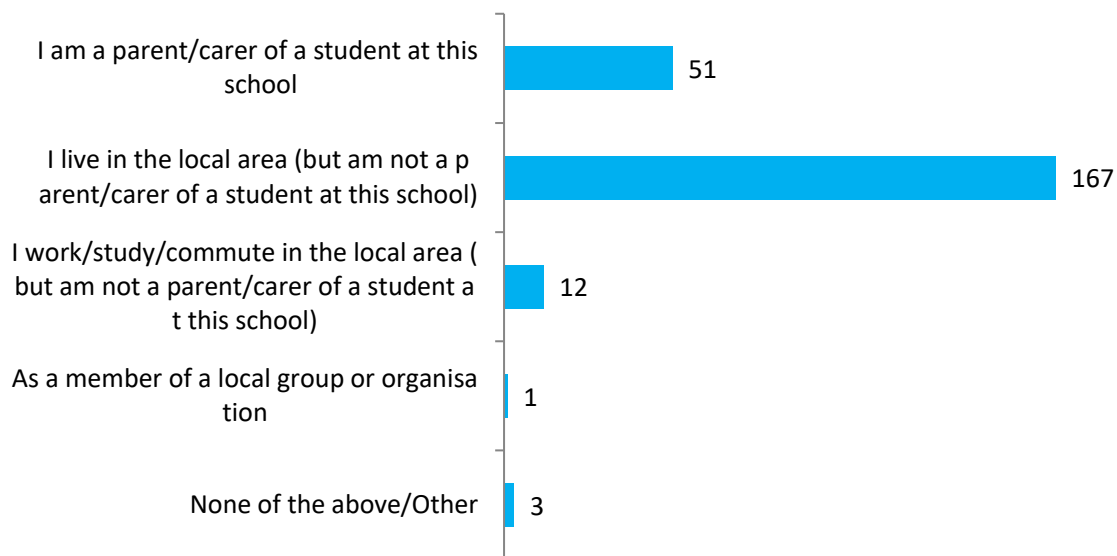

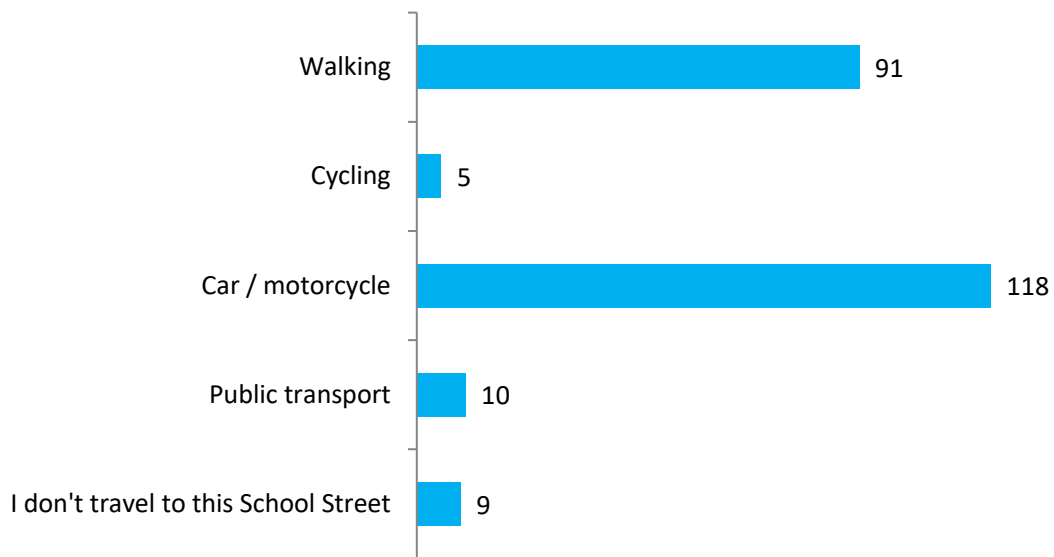

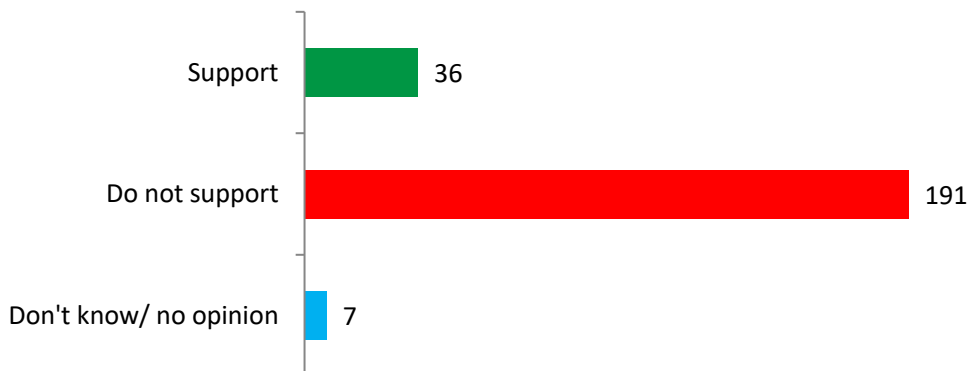

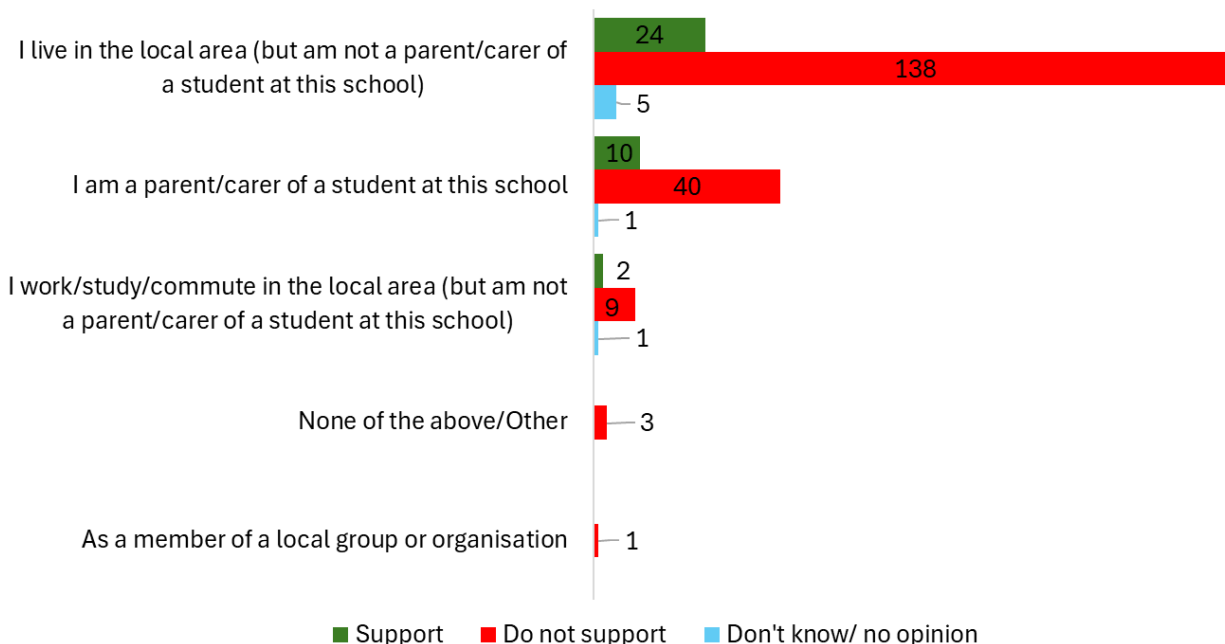

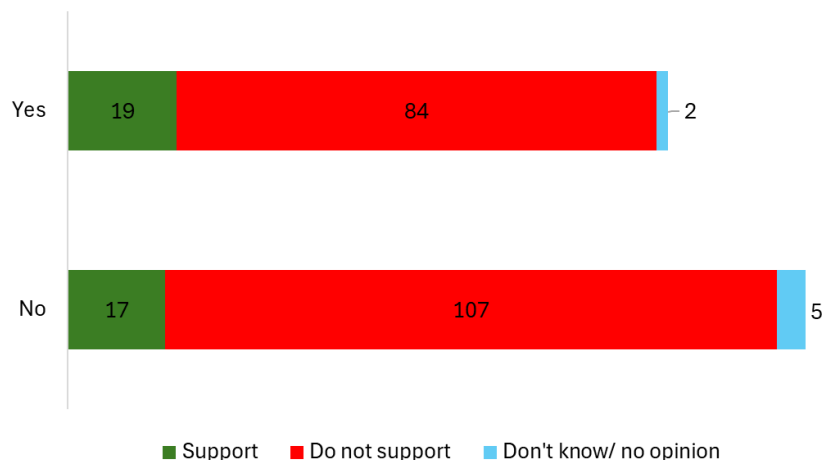

The following graph shows responses to this question based on the capacity in which respondents were responding to the consultations. Parents/carers were slightly more likely to support the School Street scheme (20%), compared to those who live in the local area (14%).

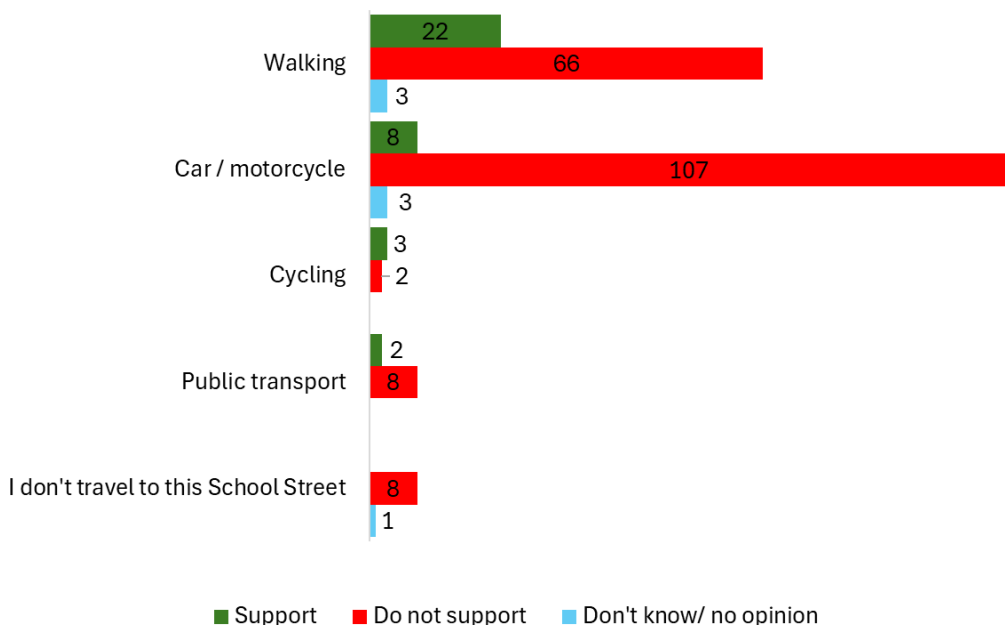


The following graph shows responses to this question based on whether respondents live in the School Street restricted area or not. Respondents who live in the School Street restricted area

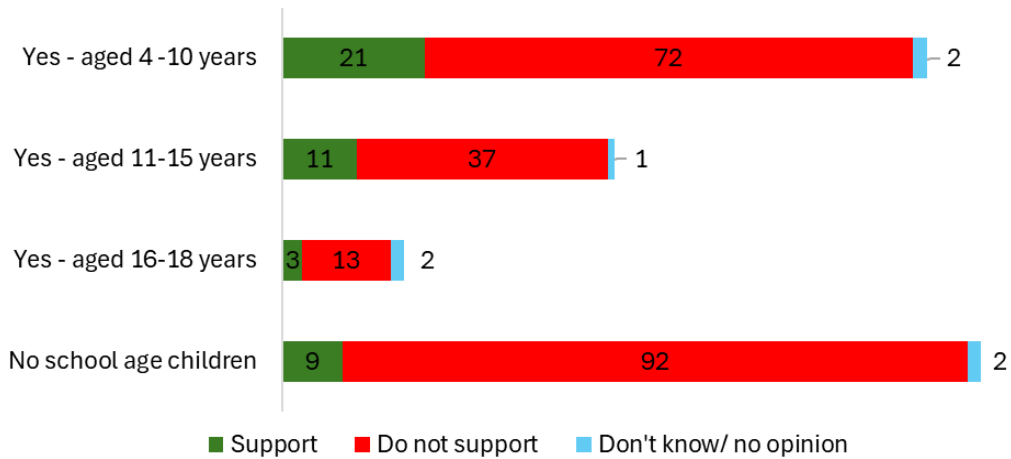
were only slightly more likely to support the scheme (18%), compared to those who live outside the restricted area (13%). Lack of support was high among both groups.



The following graph shows responses to this question based on respondents' main mode of transport for getting to/from the School Street. Respondents who drive a car or motorcycle were the most likely to say they do not support the scheme (91%), followed by those who do not travel to the School Street (89%), those who use public transport (80%), those who walk (73%), and those who cycle (40%).

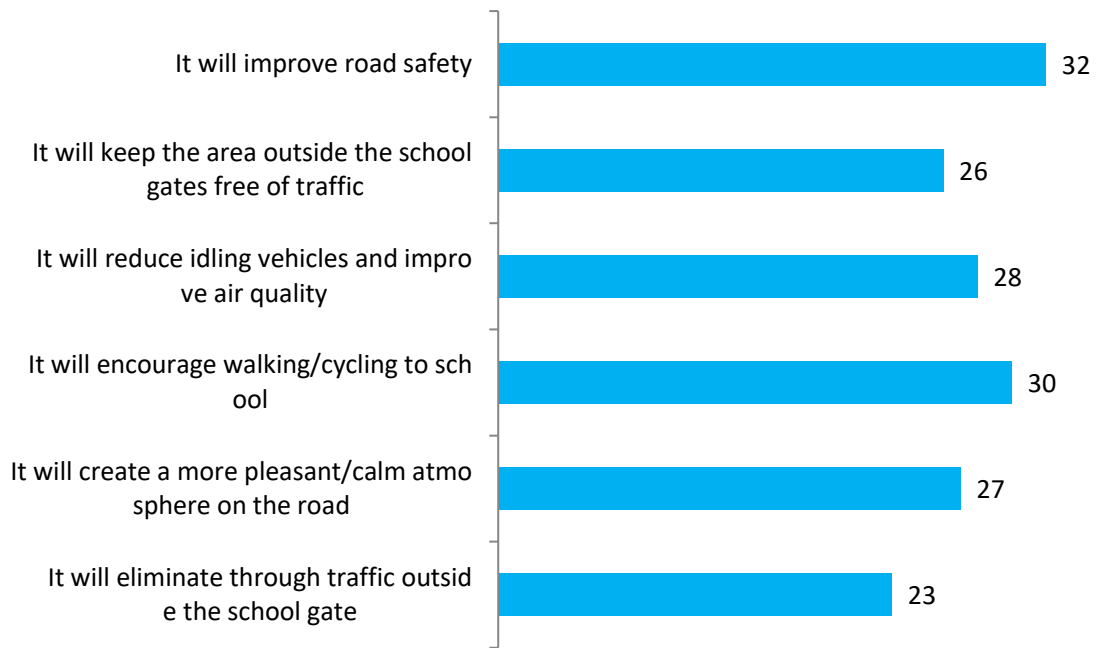

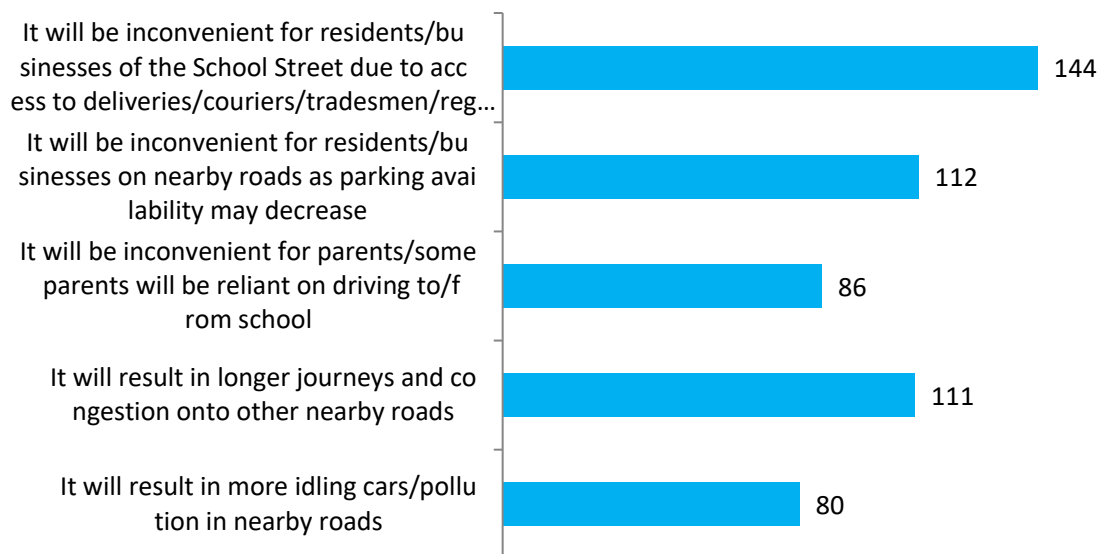

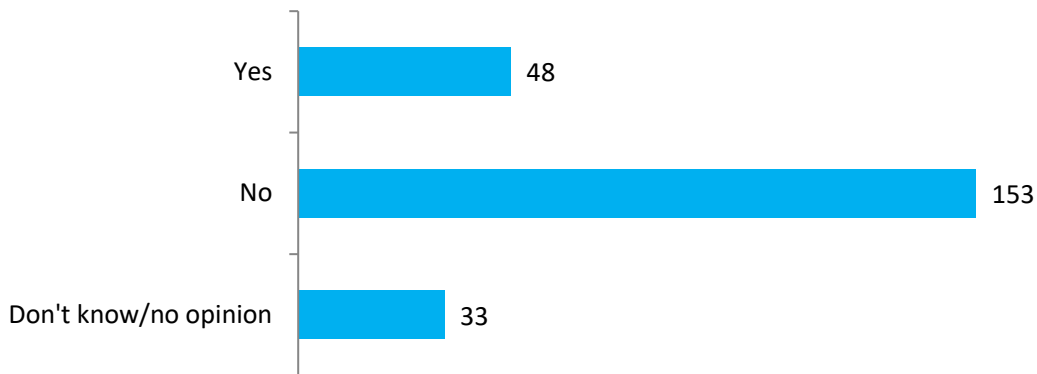

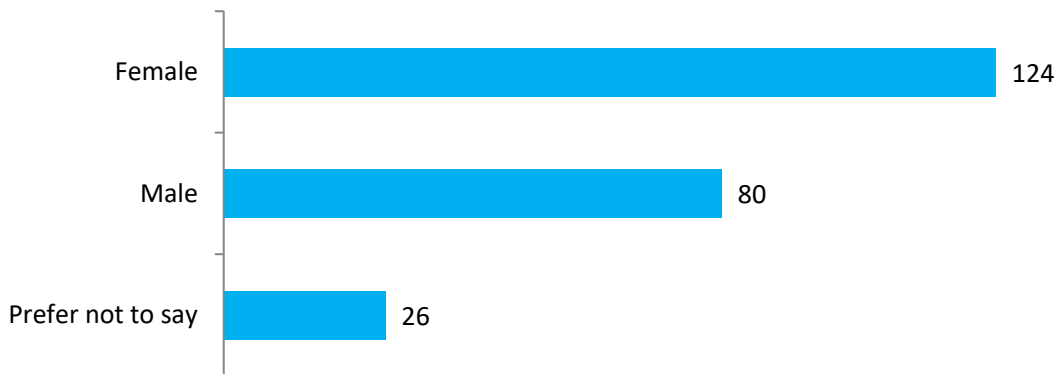

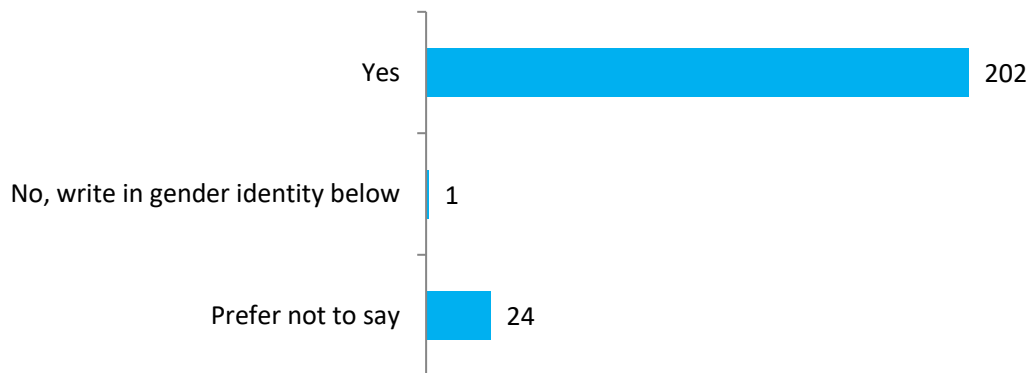

Is the gender you identify with the same as your sex registered at birth?

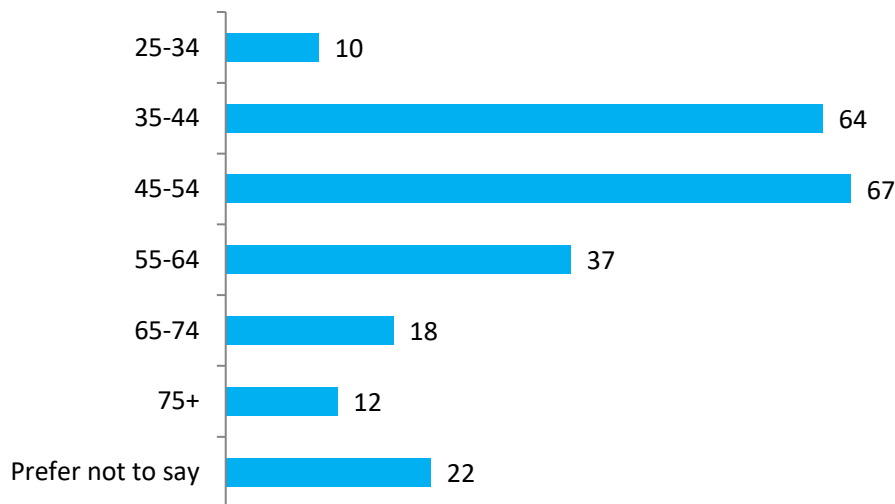

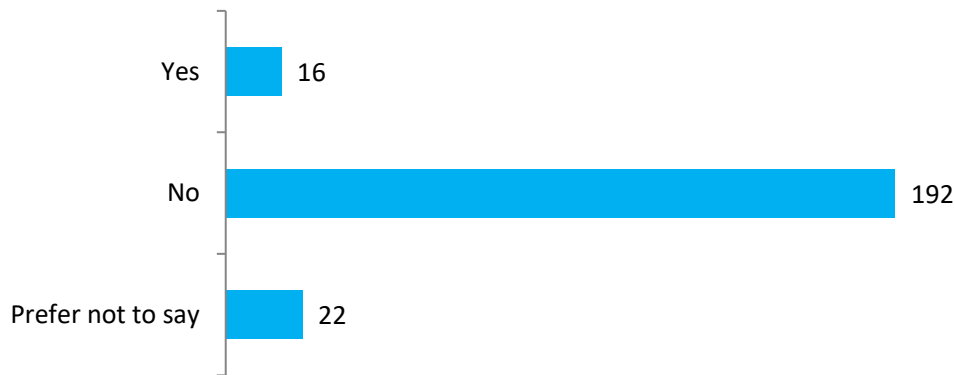

Do you consider yourself to have a disability?

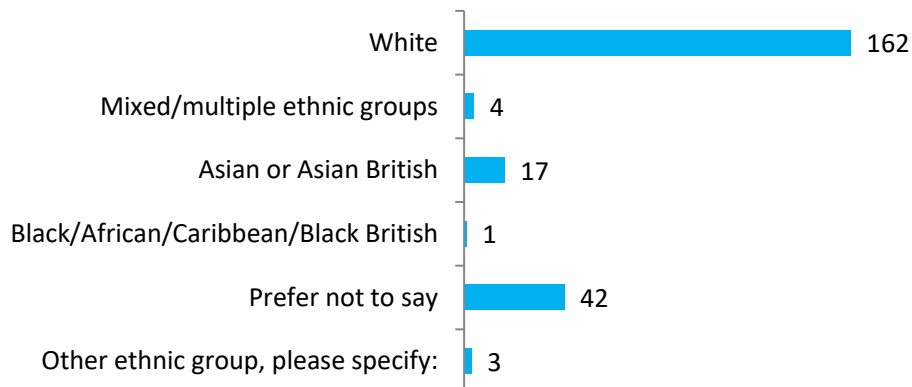

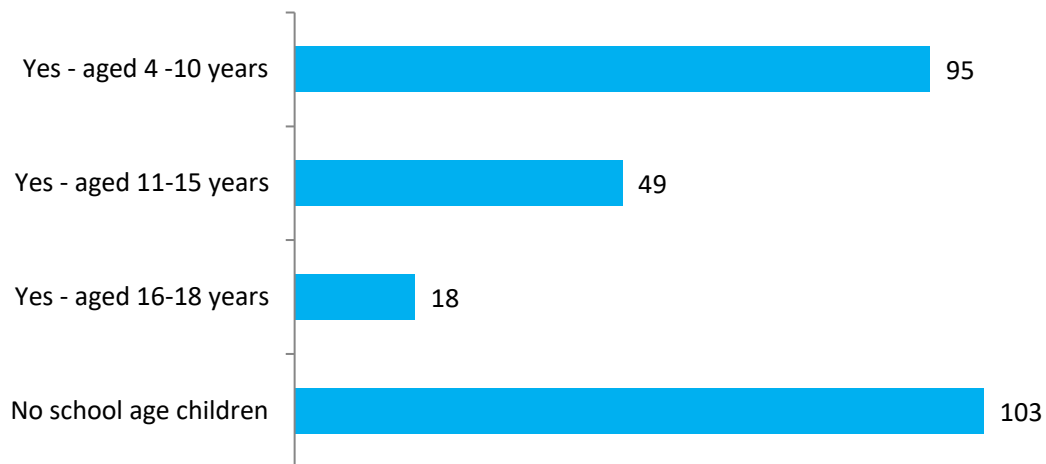
